Capacity building missions in ICCAT developing countries

(ICCAT Secretariat)

The Common Oceans Project Phase II has approved the ICCAT requests for funding for several projects and the Letter of Agreement with the FAO has been signed.

In addition to Port Inspection Training, the Secretariat included a request to fund four Compliance Missions, over a period of four years in order to assist developing countries with the most difficulties in complying with the reporting requirements contained in ICCAT Conservation and Management measures.

The Secretariat developed a short questionnaire which was circulated through ICCAT Circular #591/23 to determine which CPCs would be interested in receiving such assistance.

To date, three requests have been received (Egypt, São Tomé and Príncipe and Senegal). These requests are attached, and the Commission, as advised by the Compliance Committee, should determine the order of priority for these CPCs.

The Compliance Committee is therefore invited to review the requests and determine the most urgent case, in order to organize a compliance mission in 2024.
