Acknowledgement of the letter was received from St Kitts and Nevis, Sta Lucia submitted catch data, and Israel has informed the Secretariat of its intention of becoming a Contracting Party. No other responses were received.

Subject: Management and catches of Bluefin tuna in Gibraltar

Dear Dr Campbell,

We refer to your letter dated 12th September 2023 addressed to the Honourable Prof. John Cortes MP in relation to the management and catches of Bluefin tuna (BFT) in Gibraltar which I am replying on his behalf.

First and foremost, it is reassuring and indeed welcomed to note that the Commission appreciates the transparency and commitment demonstrated by Gibraltar from the outset to provide all the necessary statistical data in relation to BFT as well as the management measures implemented in Gibraltar. In keeping with our continued commitment to fully cooperate with the ICCAT Secretariat, please note that BFT catch statistics (Form ST02-T1NC - Version 2023a) pertaining to this year's BFT Open Season (2023) have been submitted by the Department to the email account STATS_info@iccat.int in accordance with ICCAT Circular 0866/23. An overview of the BFT Open Season statistics submitted are additionally provided in an **Appendix** to this letter. To date, the Secretariat has therefore been provided with data on BFT catches landed in Gibraltar since the inception of the BFT quota spanning the period 2015-2023.

In closing, we also take note of the concerns raised by ICCAT's leadership and take this opportunity to once again firmly reiterate our strong desire to continue our cooperation and positive engagement with the Secretariat moving forward, and to the consideration of the possibility of extending ICCAT to Gibraltar.

We remain at your disposal should you require any additional clarification on the abovementioned points and statistical data provided.
