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Dear colleagues:

I am looking forward to our upcoming second meeting of Joint Experts' Meeting on Climate Change, to be held virtually, July 2-3, 2024. This correspondence serves to provide you all with an update on the intersessional preparations for this meeting and goals for the work we will conduct over our two-day meeting.

Similar to last year's meeting, this is a joint meeting of the Commission and the SCRS. As such, the SCRS Chair Dr Craig Brown will be invited to co-facilitate this meeting with me. The success of these Joint Experts' meetings is contingent on a robust dialogue between managers and scientists; CPCs are once again encouraged to include SCRS scientists, along with other climate scientists and experts among their ranks to ensure a rich discussion during the meeting.

Our charge for this second Joint Experts' meeting is largely laid out for us in the *Resolution by ICCAT on Next Steps on the Joint Expert Group on Climate Change in 2024* (Res. 23-19). One of the key tasks called for in this Resolution is the undertaking of a "stock-take" of relevant ongoing ICCAT work that relates to, or is impacted by, climate change. To facilitate this, I reached out to the Commission Officers and Chairs of Ad hoc Working Groups to solicit their insight and contributions to this stock-take. I also coordinated with the SCRS Chair to facilitate a response from the SCRS to complete this stock-take analysis. I am currently working to summarize and present the results received as part of this process. The intention of this exercise is to facilitate meaningful dialogue at our meeting, particularly toward identifying the highest priority next steps for ICCAT to take in its climate change-related work.

After presentation and discussion of this stock-take exercise, I will invite feedback under agenda item 6 on any other priority areas of climate change work for ICCAT to take forward. In particular, Res. 23-19 encourages us to consider how to engage with stakeholder groups in this effort, and our past discussions have repeatedly emphasized the importance of exploring potential partnerships with other international organizations to leverage their expertise or capacity in climate science. I invite CPCs to prepare for discussions under this item.

After these discussions, CPCs will discuss the draft ICCAT Plan of Action on Climate Change, last discussed at the 2023 Annual Meeting as PLE_115/2023. As outlined by Res. 23-19, the goal is to facilitate a discussion that seeks to consider, revise, and aim to agree to have CPCs participating in the meeting to endorse a revised draft Plan of Action. A revised draft Plan of Action will be informed by the results of the stock-take and discussion amongst the participants of the Joint Experts' meeting. A meeting document on the stock-take exercise and PLE_115/2023 will be posted ahead of the 2-3 July meeting, and I ask CPCs to review them in advance of the discussion.

Thank you for your attention to these details and for your partnership in this important work.
