PROPOSED TABLE OF 2020 BIGEYE TUNA CATCH LIMITS

With regards to the table of 2020 catch limits circulated by the Secretariat in PA1-502, South Africa and Senegal have suggested that the table developed by the Secretariat to compile catch limits of bigeye tuna for 2020 does not accurately reflect the requirements or intent of Rec. 19-02 paragraph 4, in the following ways:

- It includes unilaterally declared national limits for a number of CPCs, presenting them as ICCAT agreed obligations, which they are not. A number of unilaterally declared national limits included in this table are inconsistent with the requirements and/or intent of paragraph 4.
- Rec. 19-02 does not contain binding limits (or rules for determining a limit) for CPCs with recent average catches of less than 1,000 t. Paragraph 4(d) states that these CPCs are instead "encouraged to maintain catch and effort at recent levels". It is therefore inaccurate to present any limits for those countries with a recent average of below 1,000 t.
- While reference to some Rec. 16-01 limits as the basis for calculating the new limits that apply under Rec. 19-02 is appropriate, it is not appropriate to directly include limits from Rec. 16-01, such as the 1,575 t or 3,500 t limits. Rec. 16-01 was replaced by Rec. 19-02 (see para. 68 of Rec 19-02) and as such those limits no longer apply.
- It is incorrect to include in any calculation of "total limits", anything for CPCs to which paragraph 4(d) applies.
- It is misleading to present a calculation of the "total limits" as "possible overharvest". It was recognised by CPCs participating in the negotiations on paragraph 4, that it is highly unlikely that all CPCs will catch their limits in any one year. Although the sum of limits was greater than the TAC amount, it is possible that the TAC could still be achieved.
- Any overage or underage allowed under paragraphs 10-12 of Rec. 19-02 and verified by SCRS data, should be noted separately in the table to ensure full transparency.
