# REPORT OF THE THIRD MEETING OF THE VIRTUAL WORKING GROUP ON REVIEW OF RULES OF PROCEDURE OF THE COMMISSION (VWG-RRP)

(Online, 28 March 2022)

## 1. Opening of the meeting

On 28 March 2022, the new Commission Chair, Ernesto Penas, convened the third meeting of the VWG-RRP, which was held online, from 12:00 to 14:00. The Secretariat served as rapporteur. Of the 38 members from 17 CPC members of the Group who received the invitation, 47.4 % participated in this meeting. The list of participants is attached as **Appendix 1**.

After welcoming the participants, the Chair expressed his satisfaction with the holding of this third meeting of the VWG-RRP, his first with the Group. The Chair noted that this Group is of high importance and recalled, as proposed in his letter distributed to the Group members, the two questions on which he would like to hear the views of members, based on the discussions so far, for him to be able to propose an informal non-paper. He stressed that he would like this process to be inclusive, called for more engagement from members while regretting the low number of participants in this Group, and pointed out that his intention is not to add unnecessary bureaucracy to the procedures.

## 2. Discussions on identified key issues

Upon request of the Chair, the Executive Secretary provided a summary of the two meetings the VWG-RRP held in 2020 and 2021. On the key issues, the Commission identified: 1) the process for the election of Commission officers, and 2) the process for submitting proposals and the progress of these following submission. He recalled that the first meeting discussed the scoping and framing of the work of the Group, while the second one focused on the nomination and election process for Commission Officers.

The Executive Secretary summarized the VWG-RRP discussions on the issue of elections to date. Some members noted that, although the Group did not come to the 2021 Annual Meeting with a concrete written proposal, the discussions it held regarding the election of Officers allowed the Commission to implement an approach for identifying and selecting interested candidates that took into consideration geographical balance, transparency, rotation, and the importance of consensus. The approaches taken to the 2021 election process should provide useful models to draw from, and it will be helpful to put on paper what worked well.

Echoing some of the suggestions for a more open consultation process, the Chair proposed that the nonpaper he would prepare be sent to all ICCAT CPCs (not just members of this Group) to ensure that they are consulted equally and avoid exacerbating/aggravating the concerns expressed about a lack of transparency in the ICCAT election process. This document will be commented on for consolidation. The Group broadly welcomed the idea of this non-paper.

A CPC was of the view that as a lot of work was done in the previous meetings of the Group, it was expected that a paper from the Chair would be presented for discussion. The Chair clarified his approach and noted that he needed to hear from CPCs first before trusting his capacity to table something for discussion; this is the main objective of this meeting.

The Group also noted the need and benefit of building greater capacity in CPCs with regard to chairing while ensuring proper rotation in Officer positions.

Regarding the issue of proposal development and submission, the Group acknowledged that it had not discussed at length the issue of how management proposals are developed and adopted. It was noted that this general decision-making process needed to be further developed and that productive discussion had been ongoing on this matter in the Standing Committee on Finance and Administration (STACFAD). The VWG-RRP supported coordination with STACFAD to ensure no duplication of effort.

For the work calendar, the Group agreed to work toward development of a document on the Officers election process to submit for Commission consideration this year with a view to having new guidance in place in time for the next election year in 2023.

## 3. Additional question on meetings rapporteurs

After addressing the two key issues he had raised at the beginning of the meeting, the Chair proposed to the Group to discuss the issue of rapporteurs for ICCAT meetings. In general, the Group felt that the offer of a rapporteur should remain voluntary. The Secretariat noted, while thanking those CPCs that usually provide rapporteurs, that this volunteer approach had sometimes proved to be ineffective and that it would continue to encourage CPCs to take on this role even though they might face constraints such as limited staffing. The Secretariat also assured CPCs that all necessary support would be provided to rapporteurs (in terms of availability of meeting audio, facilitation of all required documents, answering all questions where possible). One CPC mentioned that his recent experience had been very positive and reiterated his willingness to continue to offer his services whenever possible, and others requested assistance in supporting the training of rapporteurs.

One CPC mentioned that he does not speak any of the Commission's languages and asked that the possibility of hiring professional rapporteurs when there are no volunteers be explored. The Secretariat shared some information on the estimated basic costs of this approach and suggested that more incentives be offered to entice volunteers. Another CPC proposed to have a formal mechanism to create a group of rapporteurs that would service the meetings although it was unclear how this could be effectively accomplished.

The Group agreed that its meetings should be published on the ICCAT meetings web page as is done for the meetings of other ICCAT bodies.

## 4. Next steps

The Chair indicated his intention to share with all CPCs, a non-paper that he would draft covering the two primary issues that have been under discussion by the VWG-RRP since its inception as well as the question of the rapporteurs. Sufficient time will be provided for CPCs to provide comments on the non-paper after which at least one more meeting of the VWG-RRP would be convened in 2022 to try to reach agreement on guidelines or another appropriate document that could be brought to the 2022 ICCAT Annual Meeting for consideration.

The Chair thanked the participants and adjourned the meeting.
