On 7 June 2024, the Government of **Costa Rica** had deposited the instrument of accession to the International Convention for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas. In accordance with Article XIV, paragraph 3 of the Convention, Costa Rica is already a full member of the Commission.

New appointments

In January 2024, **Ms. Stasa Tensek** was hired as the Officer of the ICCAT research and data collection programmes. Ms. Tensek has been working since 2015, under annual contracts, as the Assistant Coordinator of the Atlantic-wide Research Programme for Bluefin Tuna.

In March 2024, **Mr Fabio Fiorellato** was hired as the ICCAT Biostatistician, following the voluntary separation from service of Mr Carlos Palma.

Also in March, **Mr Aitor Elorriaga** was hired as a Software Developer (IOMS) for a nine-month period, to integrate the UN/FLUX system for vessels data exchange, 80% of the development costs of which will be covered by a contract with the European Union. At the end of this period, his contract will become part of the ICCAT staff.



In May 2024, Mr Álvaro Fúster was hired as an IT Specialist Technician.

In June 2024, **Mr Dashiel Portel** was hired as Software Developer (IOMS), after completion of the 12-month contract as Software Developer (IOMS), to integrate the vessel management system, financed by the European Union. This appointment was requested by the Online Reporting Technology Working Group.

Following the departure of Ms. Jenny Cheatle, the Department of Compliance has been restructured, with Mr Alberto Parrilla, who until then held the position of Compliance Officer, taking over as Head of Department. This post has been filled by Dr Valérie Samedy, who was working as Technical Officer and VMS Manager, leaving this post vacant. The vacancy announcement was circulated at the end of May. Following the selection process, Mr Felix Mergarejo Dremova (11 November 2024) will be contracted.

In addition, Mr Fabio Fiorellato has informed the Secretariat of his voluntary separation from service, effective on 25 November 2024. Following his notice, the Secretariat will be contracted **Mr Bruno Deprez (ranked second from Biostatistician selection process)**, who has accepted the position and will join the Secretariat on 11 November 2024.
